Children of No One

As a child, one of the worst things that anyone ever said to me, even if it was a joke, was: "You were adopted." The thought that my parents were not my parents had a particularly unsettling effect on my young mind and no doubt on others who experienced this tactless insult from the tongues of other young people.
